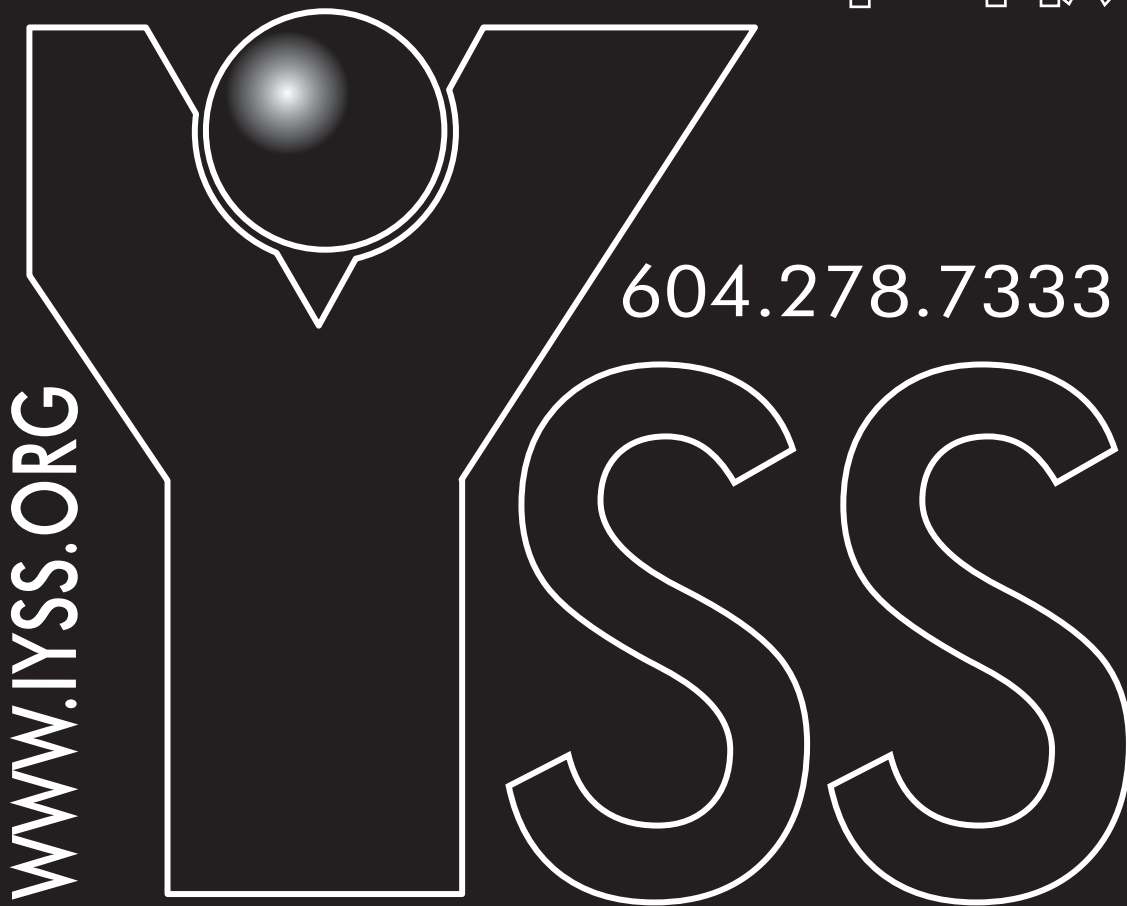

Principle

The Integration Youth Services Society is a government registered non-profit organization serving young people and their families in Canada. Our approach is to facilitate self-help through providing integrated and holistic services in the areas of education, personal growth, community outreach, and cultural and recreational activities.

History of IYSS

In September 1999, the founder of IYSS, Esther Ho, started the Mustard Seed Education Path, integrating academic, hobbies, music, personal and family growth courses and activities, hoping to serve Chinese families,

children and youth. During this process, resources and man power was very limited. Therefore, at the end of 2001, Esther started putting together a group of people with the same goal. In March 2002, IYSS was founded and registered as a non-profit organization. All operations of the Mustard Seed Education Path, such as Mustard Seed Children Theatre, Youth Band, Spring Break and Summer Day Camp, and Self-development courses, have been integrated with the operation of IYSS. Mustard Seed Education Path is now a private organization supporting the operation of IYSS.

Our Mission

We believe every young person is capable of becoming a leader in his/her respective role in society, providing that he/she:

- i. learns about oneself (self-awareness) and accepts oneself (self-acceptance)

We hope to facilitate young people's personal growth and to walk with them.

- ii. improves communication skills to facilitate mutual understanding

We hope to bridge the communication gap between young people and their families

- iii. discovers ones' potentials and maximizes them

We hope to stimulate young people to search for their meanings and directions in life.

A Look Back

Results of our Services

In the past year, over 5176 head count have benefited from the services provided by the Integration Youth Services Society-- by means of courses and programs.

There are 7 groups running regularly, including the Youth Leadership Training Program-- the Youth Book Project, Parent Interactive Support Group, Mustard Seed Adults' Theater, Mustard Seed Youth's Theater

Mustard Seed Children's Theater, Mustard Seed Parent Group for Children's Theater, and Youth Band --- Memory For the performance of Mustard Seed Children's Theater in 2005—Sun Yat San, the number of audience has exceeded 1000 people, with great support from the Federal, Provincial and City counselors.

The number of members registered in 2005 are listed as follows:

Individual members: 119, Family members: 10, Lifetime Individual members: 7, Lifetime Family members: 20, with a total of 156 people.

Furthermore, there are 81 volunteers registered for services.

What is IYSS Youth Book Project?

The goal of the IYSS Youth Book Project is to publish a book which focuses on Chinese parent-to-child relationship in Vancouver. The team is made up with a group of motivated individuals ranged from the age of 13 to 22. The information in the book is highly objective, and data is mainly obtained through questionnaires designed by the IYSS executives. Our target is to have 1000 youths ranging from the age of 13 to 20 as well as 500 parents to participate in the surveys. Consequently, the book will compile the opinions of 1500 individuals.

Stages of the Project:

Organizing and Recruiting April 2004 ~ June 2004

-Data Analysis – Compiling the data in the completed survey for analysis
